Sonny Linder won the stop card of the week for observing that the fuel transfer hose appeared to be worn thus having potential to fail while transferring fuel between the supply boat and the rig which could cause an environmental spill. The hose was brought onto the deck of the rig and inspected where the damage was found to be superficial. The hose was returned to service but will be inspected periodically to insure that it is in a safe condition to use. Good observation as a fuel spill could cause serious environmental damage.
